

Over the years, Farther Foundation has supported several <u>HighSight</u> students with scholarships for enrichment travel programs. HighSight provides tutoring, mentoring, college counseling and other support for high school students. At its recent event, 20 high school graduates stepped to the microphone to announce where they would attend college in the fall. Fifteen students specifically mentioned their summer enrichment travel opportunity as being an essential factor in their success.

We were able to visit with three new graduates who we first supported with scholarships in 2013.

Christine and Lizbeth used their Farther Foundation scholarships to travel to China and Panama respectively. They have both gone on to win highly competitive scholarships from the State Department's National Security Language Initiative, where this summer Christine will return to China while Lizbeth studies Arabic in Morocco. This fall Christine will begin her college experience at Knox College and Lizbeth at Furman University. >>
